The recommendation to delete Political Science results from program analysis and personnel changes. Based on a recent program review of Political Science, a decision by the College of Arts and Sciences to pursue a different direction for its social science programs, and the reduction from three faculty members to one, Political Science is no longer viable as a major.

Impact on majors, minors, and other programs as well as existing students and faculty:

Students actively seeking the major or the minors who maintain continuous enrollment will be allowed to complete the requisite coursework. Students will cease to be recruited for the major effective immediately, and students will no longer be allowed to add on the major or the minor following the Fall 2021 census.

Political Science listing for the catalog will be removed in its entirety including the major, the three minors, and the specializations. Courses under solely the POL prefix will cease to be offered or listed. Termination of catalog listing to be no later than Fall 2024 catalog. Termination of recruiting to be Fall 2021. Termination of opportunity to declare the major or minors to be the Fall 2021 census date.

The current active students as of the Fall 2021 census who maintain continuous enrollment will be allowed to continue their studies and complete their major/minor. Courses will be regularly offered until May 2024 to allow for this.
